"In-kind contributions" include any documented contributions, such as real estate, goods or services, and labor and should be valued using a defensible method. For example, rates for volunteers should be consistent with those paid for similar work in other state or local government activities; donated supplies should be assigned a reasonable value not to exceed lowest fair market value. Providing 'dollar-for dollar' matching resources is mandatory for private entities. Providing matching resources is not mandatory for public entities, but is a measure of the cost effectiveness of your proposal.
